BASQUE CENTER FACILITY UPDATES

The Euzkaldunak Board of Directors is continuing to closely follow COVID-19 state and local guidance and statistics with regard to opening the Basque Center Bar and the larger facility.

Bars and nightclubs are still a higher-risk environment for COVID-19 spread, so **as of the August board meeting, the Euzkaldunak board decided to continue to keep the Basque Center Bar and Hall closed and to cancel the September and October monthly dinners.**

The board will reevaluate the facility status and event calendar each month at our regularly scheduled board meeting. Once the Basque Center bar does reopen, we will be following state guidelines and protocols for sanitation and physical distancing to ensure the safety of employees, members and guests.

Nun esteka, han alha

It would freely translate into "where the string is, that is where the pasture is." The connotation is, "where you live, that's where you have to make a living". This seems appropriate in the case of Basques who came to Boise and had to adapt to the local circumstances and constraints in order to make a living.

Zenbat buru, hainbat aburu

"So many men, so many minds" means that you have as many opinions as you have people, which seems to be so true among Basques, always having a hard time agreeing with each other. Or a similar one that I have heard here in the US is *zazpi probintzi, zazpi iritzi*, meaning "seven provinces, seven opinions."

And given the ongoing discussions related to the COVID-19 virus (about the vaccine, about going back to school, regarding the use of masks, etc.), here are TWO proverbs, where in English there is the same or similar saying, which seem suited to this situation...

Aguro eta ondo, usoak bakarrik

"Good and quickly, seldom meet." Meaning that to do things well, they have to be done slowly, gently. This one is similar: "Haste makes waste."

BASQUE CENTER "HISTORY CORNER"

As Euzkaldunak members today, we might take for granted that we have a place to call our own and celebrate our Basque heritage in downtown Boise, especially our youngest members who don't know much about the history of our facility and charter members.

To promote education and celebrate our history, the Basque Center Renovation Committee is starting a monthly column about our Basque Center at 601 Grove. This column will chronicle how the Basque Center came to be, the current state of the facility, and the changes needed to ensure we have a place to gather for generations to come.

THE FOUNDING OF EUZKALDUNAK

the meeting

It was time...for a Basque Center.

The events that took place to begin our Boise Euzkaldunak are meticulously recorded in a book of "Minutes 1949–1959." From the beautiful handwritten notes, Julie Uberuaga and her brother Joe P. Uberuaga provide the details of the first meetings that took place to get our organization started.

On February 6, 1949, the people that would go on to found Euzkaldunak had their first organizational meeting at the Western Square Hall. Tom Bicandi called the meeting to order. He explained that for business to be conducted in an orderly fashion, it would be necessary to appoint a chairman and Secretary-Treasurer—for that night only.

Louis Madarieta was appointed chairman; Julie Uberuaga and her brother, Joe Uberuaga were appointed Secretary-Treasurer. Louis Madarieta gave a brief history of "how" and "why" this meeting came to be. One of the members, Juanita Aldrich (Juanita "Jay" Uberuaga Aldrich Hormaechea), had six months previously started a "Jota" class to teach younger Basques traditional Basque dance. These dancers had started to have picnics and dances and had received proceeds from events and performances. They accumulated the sum of \$2,666.01. This group of dancers decided to donate this money with the goal of erecting a building to house the activities of Basques in and around Boise. In order to handle this money and the huge sums of money needed for such a project, it would be necessary to incorporate.

At this first meeting, the group of Basques accomplished all of the following: select a group of directors, set up a committee to establish rules or by-laws for incorporation, name the organization, appoint a dance committee, and set a date for the next meeting. The names offered for the new organization were: Euzkaldunak, Central Basque, Basque Center, Centro-Basque, American-Euzkaldunak, La Jota Rendezvous, and Basques of America. With a total of 49 votes, the winner was **Euzkaldunak.** The next meeting was to be on February 20 at 8:00 at Western Square Hall. Everyone was asked to bring another "Euzkalduna" with them.
