BASQUE CENTER HISTORY CORNER

To promote education and celebrate our history, the Basque Center Renovation Committee writes a monthly "history corner" column that chronicles how the Basque Center came to be, the current state of the facility, and the changes needed to ensure we have a place to gather for generations to come.

Traditions pt 1: Men's Societies

Long before Euzkaldunak had incorporated in 1949, several organizations of Basque men had formed. Most active were Socorros Mutuos, the Anduiza Society and the American Basque Fraternity.

Socorros Mutuos may have been founded as early as 1928. The goals of the group were not only to hold social gatherings, but also help negotiate medical and hospitalization for members and their families. The Anduiza Society was formed primarily for the financial self-protection of the hotel or boarding house owner, who was often stuck with a medical or hospital bill from one of his boarders. The American Basque Fraternity came later (as early as 1932) and first was organized as a social club. This group also was able to add medical and insurance benefits for members and an option for dependents. Many men belonged to more than one of the organizations. Annual membership rates for each ranged from \$30 to \$38.

In February 1950, John Bastida (as Euzkaldunak vice-president) and several Board members sent invitations to directors of Socorro Mutuos and the American Basque Fraternity to discuss the possibility of coming together under Euzkaldunak.

(At this time, we don't know what happened with the Anduiza Society. Maybe because that group's purpose varied a bit from the others, their organization as such was not involved to unite with the other groups. However, many of the Anduiza directors were also members of either Socorro Mutuos and/or the American Basque Fraternity. If anybody knows about the Anduiza Society, let us know!)

John Bastida explained at the February 12 meeting that the groups had been called together as a result of Euzkaldunak's efforts to sell membership cards. Many questioned the reason or necessity for three societies. John Bastida explained that Euzkaldunak was strictly social and "would gain only your moral support and good will; we are not after financial aid." He further explained that, similar to the Knights of Columbus. they could have a social organization with an insurance policy, completely separate.


The groups held meetings in 1950 on February 12, 26; March 12, 19, 22, 26, 31. It was very complicated! The insurance issues were explored thoroughly. Socorros Mutuos had long used the services of Dr. Fred Pittenger, along with doctors Smith and Parkinson in his office. Dr. Koelsch had provided excellent service with reasonable rates (\$6/year) to members of the American Basque Fraternity since 1933!

Uniting the memberships would up the total to about 400 men, 150 of whom had wives and children. The people at these meetings (all men except Carmen Solosabal) had to explore rates from other insurance companies and check on various services, as well as what would be excluded. What about the costs of services for women? How much to add to dependents? Do we have a "fixed-fee" schedule?

A committee of John Bastida, John Aldape, John Luque and Phil Uberuaga met with a representative of Aetna Insurance Group who flew to Boise from Salt Lake City. For the same protection that most were receiving now, the premiums would more than double. What would be included? Present medical and hospitalization services would need to be maintained. Justo Murelaga had done the research on medication costs; his opinion was that it would raise the costs too much, and it was ruled out.

Additional doctors were asked to provide service—Dr. Everett Jones, Dr. Ralph Jones, Dr. Shaw, Dr. David, Dr. Mack, Dr. Forney, and Dr. Thomas.

By April 16, the groups united (perhaps miraculously)—all came to an agreement. Euzkaldunak Board of Directors would manage the overall organization but it was not absorbing the insurance. Trustees would be elected for the medical insurance. Socorro Mutuos and the American Basque Fraternity would dissolve their organizations and come under the umbrella of Euzkaldunak, Inc.

(We do not know—after all this hard work—for how long there were options for medical insurance for Euzkaldunak members. Again, if anybody knows, let us know!)

NEW MEMBERS

A new member is one who did not have a membership in the previous year, OR who neglected to pay their dues by the due date. New members pay a \$10 new member fee when they join the Basque Center.

For instance, if you join in April and pay the \$60 new membership dues, your membership expires on December 31 of that same year. Membership renewals are due by mid-January of each new year. If you do not remit dues until March, you are again considered a new member and dues owing are \$60 instead of the \$50 renewal rate. The mid-January renewal deadline applies for every calendar year if you want to avoid the new member fee.


