
2021 CHILDREN'S HALLOWEEN PARTY

As we have discussed in members' meetings prior to the pandemic and in our newsletters, an improved facility is vital to our community. History Corner: La Organización Independiente Social (Ladies' Organization)

Shortly after a group of Boise Basque men founded their insurance organization called Socorros Mutuos (which has been described in a previous History Corner in this newsletter), the women set up their own organization in January of 1933. Women who were Basque or were married to a Basque man could join "La Organización Independiente Social." The women, who needed to be at least 16 years old, established a life insurance policy program. They paid annual dues which provided an insurance payback at the time of the member's death. In the first year, the annual dues were \$2 and the death benefit was \$100.

In addition to the insurance program, the ladies acted in support of one another—one person compared the club to a Ladies Relief Society. If a family suffered a hardship, the ladies would provide food, child care, transportation and oftentimes helped to pay burial costs. Individual members donated directly at the time of need or they contributed to a "ways and means" fund to help others when the occasion arose. The ladies knitted and crocheted and baked and prepared homemade items which they sold through raffles and at various events to raise money. They had many card parties where money was donated to the fund. The organization helped out not only members of their own club but also families in the community that were in need. As a group, they also provided service to Euzkaldunak in sponsoring or working at an event.

Records indicate that in 1950 dues were \$3 per year; the death benefit was \$400 and a \$10 flower arrangement was provided. Between 1963 through 1978, the dues were \$7 and the death benefit had increased to \$500. From 1945 to 1978, there were over 300 members in La Organización Independiente Social. By 1990, dues were raised to \$10 with a death benefit of \$750. (The flowers were discontinued; instead, a donation was made to the Basque Center or the Basque Museum in the name of the deceased.) Through the '70s and beyond, the club mainly served its membership for insurance purposes. Socially, the ladies met once a year for an annual business meeting and luncheon.

Women who were important during the founding and in leadership and record keeping: Tomasa Erquiaga, Julie Garmendia, Marie Arregui, Rose Dick, Rose Arana, Joan Prickett and Adriana Groff. The current officers and board members are: Begone Rementeria Zabala, President; Luise Guisasola Echevarria, Vice President; Anita Arana Bumgarner, Secretary-Treasurer; and board members Irene Mingo Baalson, Antonia Arana Bicandi, Jean Mingo Cottier, Petra Arana Spolar.

The organization is still active for those women who became members no later than the early '80s. By this time, a restructuring had taken place and La Organización Independiente Social found it necessary to close to new members/policyholders. Today's members pay \$15 per year and have a \$1,000 death benefit. It remains an organization for insurance purposes, with approximately 56 remaining members. While most members live in Idaho, many have maintained their membership residing in several other states. The ladies range in age from 50+ to 99 years of age. La Organización's most senior members are Julia Uberuaga Coleman and Joan Arriola Prickett, both of whom turned 99 in the summer of 2021.

The founding of La Organización Independiente Social is important to the history of Euzkaldunak in that this was the first club established by and for women. The Basque Girls' Club (often called "The Knitting Club") soon followed, organized as a social-service club in 1936. This club was featured in the June 2021 issue of the Euzkaldunak newsletter. The second group was important in providing support and assistance to many of the Basque Center's events for over 50 years. Both groups laid the groundwork for Aiztan Artean, which got its start in the fall of 1972—also as a social-service group. With over 50 members, Aiztan hopes to continue to provide support to our Basque community for years to come.
