UDALEKU: N.A.B.O.'s BASQUE CULTURE SUMMER CAMP

Every year N.A.B.O. sponsors, and a Basque club hosts, Udaleku--our two-week Basque Culture Summer Camp. Participants ages 10-15 have an opportunity to learn more about their Basque heritage while having fun and making new friends.

Formerly known as Music Camp, Udaleku began in April 1974 when various Basque clubs joined together to create the North American Basque Organizations, Inc. (N.A.B.O.) with the purpose of promoting and encouraging our common Basque heritage. Since those early days the bonds between Basques here in the United States have been strengthened and extended. The annual Udaleku sponsored by N.A.B.O., and hosted by one of our member organizations, has contributed much to this growth.

The first camp was held in Boise (Bogus Basin) in 1975. Since then, hundreds of young Basques have gathered for two weeks each summer in a different city of the extended Basque community in the United States. Under the direction of local and visiting talent from Europe, participants study Basque folk dance, music (either txistu or accordion), singing and games (such as the card game "mus" and "pala").

Besides being a good learning experience, the camp offers the participants a great opportunity to develop ties and friendships with other young Basques from many states whose parents and ancestors came from both the northern and southern parts of "Euskal Herria" or the Basque country. The relationships formed over the two-week period increases the present and future interaction between all of our Basque clubs. Udaleku is a unique experience for both the participants--who meet other Basques from other communities--and for the opportunity to teach younger generations of Basque-Americans about their culture. The camp is meant to impart to

young Basque-Americans an appreciation for the uniqueness of their heritage.

Udaleku 2022 will be in Bakersfield, CA, from June 17 – June 25. Tuition is \$450, with a discount available for families with multiple children participating. Participants must be between ages 10-15 on September 1 to be eligible. Poxpolins will not be provided to students for txistu class. Students should bring their own, or can purchase one from N.A.B.O. for \$30.00. The theme for this year's summer camp is: Nafarroa.

This year the applications will be a two-part process, starting with the Intent to Participate form.

The link to this form will go live on March 1 at 6:00 PM PST. Spots fill up quickly, so plan to register as soon as the link is live. The form can be found on the N.A.B.O Udaleku page at

https://nabasque.eus/udaleku_application.html.

Submission of the Intent to Register form will put you on the entry list, and full applications along with instructions for payment will be sent as spots are available.

History Corner: Oinkari Lummi trip

History Corner is a featured column in the Euzkaldunak newsletter that is written by members of the Basque Center Renovation Committee. Our seven-decade old building is aging and needs our enthusiasm and support to carry our traditions forward for the next seven decades and beyond. The goals of the History Corner column are: 1) highlight the many beloved traditions we can carry out thanks to having access to a Basque Center, and 2) educate members about our rich Boise Basque history.

In May of 1996, the Oinkari Basque Dancers were invited to perform and to educate elementary school children on the Lummi Reservation, which is located near Bellingham, Washington. On Monday, May 20, eight Oinkaris piled into a rented Ford passenger van. (There may have been an issue with the rental office not wanting to hand over a huge vehicle to eight kids aged 19 to 21, but Miren Artiach was able to convince them to do so).

They loaded the van with costumes, equipment, and educational items on loan from the Basque Museum and headed north from Boise. The Oinkari dancers on the trip were, in alphabetical order: Xanti Alcelay (navigator), Jill Aldape, Johnny Aldape (driver), Andrea Arana, Jacqueline Bicandi, Jude Gary, Erin Hardesty, and Ryan Schaffner.

After staying the night at a motel in Bellingham, the Oinkaris drove to the Lummi Reservation on Tuesday. The day was spent teaching the students about Basque culture, sport, cuisine, language, etc. Xanti would give each class an exhaustive description of the fronton sports and describe that shaking hands with a pilota player was like “shaking hands with a rock.” Each lesson ended with a brief performance which included everyone joining in for Tamborrada.

That evening, the Oinkaris were invited to an outdoor ceremony where members of the Lummi Tribe performed and engaged in a drum circle. The tribal elders spoke about what they perceived as shared experiences between the Lummi and Basques in Boise. They assumed that Basques also lived in separate areas and were considered different from the population as a whole. The dancers explained that the Basques in Boise had assimilated gradually into American culture as they arrived over a period of 100 years. The Oinkaris were split into pairs and assigned to places to stay overnight on the reservation. This was an eye-opening experience because some of the accommodations were trailer homes that were in need of repair. It made the dancers grateful for the things they had in Boise.

On Wednesday, the entire school attended an assembly in the gymnasium. Many of the Lummi students performed traditional dances in regalia (their term for costumes). After the Oinkaris performed,



they were greeted by some older members of the tribe and given gifts. One tribal elder gave a speech and then pointed the microphone at the Oinkaris. Jude happened to be the closest, and the tribal elder leaned towards him as a gesture for him to take the microphone. There was no chance that Jude was going to make any speech that day, so Jude just stared at the elder. After what seemed like minutes of silence, Jacqueline grabbed the mic and said a few words of thanks. The dancers agreed that had they waited for Jude to speak, they'd still be standing in the gym.

The next day, the Oinkaris loaded up the van and headed north to Canada. Crossing the border was a breeze in those days! In Vancouver, they checked into a single motel suite that had just a couple of beds, which meant the boys would be sleeping on a couch or on the floor. They toured the beautiful city of Vancouver and visited some Canadian clubs in the evening. Because all dancers were 19 or over (meeting the legal age), they were able to compare the establishments with our Basque Center.

On Friday morning, the Oinkaris jumped in the van and headed back to Boise (Google Maps says it's an 11-hour drive). In order to pass the time, they played Trivial Pursuit, split into two teams - boys vs. girls. The game was quite competitive for a while, until the girls seemed to be answering obscure questions about Vichyssoise (cold potato soup) and Xavier Cugat (a Spanish bandleader that held a chihuahua under his arm while conducting). They still haven't owned up to it, but it turns out that the girls were cheating by reading the cards in advance!

Over 25 years later, this one-of-a-kind trip has stayed with these eight Oinkaris. Everyone who went has chimed in to recall stories and laugh at the experience ahead of this article's writing.
