In April of 1949, 516 members of the Basque community became charter members of the newly inaugurated Euzkaldunak, Inc.



History Corner: Briska

History Corner is a featured column in the Euzkaldunak newsletter that is written by members of the Basque Center Renovation Committee. Our seven-decade old building is aging and needs our enthusiasm and support to carry our traditions forward for the next seven decades and beyond. The goals of the History Corner are: 1) highlight the many beloved traditions we can carry out thanks to having access to a Basque Center, and 2) educate members about our rich Boise Basque history.



Playing cards has always been an integral part of our Basque community and our Basque Center. In fact, when the Basque Center was being planned, those involved in the building design ensured there was a space for members to play cards. One of the various card games played by members of our community is Briska.

Although not as popular as the game of Mus among the various Basque communities, Briska has remained popular at the Basque Center. And, as far as we know, Euzkaldunak is the only club that continues to hold an annual Briska tournament for its members. The first Briska tournament held at the Basque Center was in

1971, and the winning team was Fulgencio Legarreta and Julian Basterechea.

The Euzkaldunak Briska tournament is held annually, usually at the end of March and early April. Members gather on Sunday evenings, forming two-person teams; they play to see who can outplay the other teams. Most of the players who were born in the Basque Country shared their stories of learning to play at an early age, usually before ten years old. Their teachers were often Amumas, Aitxitxas and Tias—who sometimes had more time to teach than their Amas and Aitas. These players have memories of being at family events—and Briska play would begin after dinner and continue into the evening. They also remember their Amumas, Amas and Tias going out for Briska nights during the week. The continuation of playing Briska here in Idaho is one that brings friends together. Whether players met at a home or at the Basque Center, a friendly competition developed among friends each week. An unwritten rule was that players team up with a friend instead of a spouse. This is considered a good way to avoid arguments.

Julian Lete recalls an eight-person Briska game where there was a lot of yelling and arguing—and it didn't matter if someone was playing with a spouse. Players laughing at good plays, taking points from a spouse or friends—this still occurs today in a friendly but heated game of Briska.

Most of the players who learned to play here in the United States also began when they were young—also from their family members. Many learned just by watching the game as their amumas (sometimes even berramumas) and friends played. Some of the players who are new to the game learned by taking lessons at the Basque Center or by watching the game. There are even a few who learned from their children who had picked up the game outside the home (such as at Udaleku). There was a time when the Sunday "regulars" or those who were tournament players wondered if the Briska games would survive. However, as younger people learned and joined tournament play, the question was answered. We are seeing an increased number of tournament players—this year 17 teams. The

oldest player was 87; the youngest team had a 12-year old and a 13-year old. The older players from the Basque Country express their thoughts regarding if Briska will continue for years to come... "Yes, as long as the young ones keep playing and others learn, it will continue."








SAVE THE DATE - SAN INAZIO 2022
