The Morzilla dinner is open to the public, and no reservations are required. It will be a "first come, first served" meal.

The first seating will begin at 5:15 PM, and the second seating will begin at 6:30 PM. The price for the November dinner is \$20 for adults and \$10 for children 10 and under. Wine and other beverages can be purchased in the dining room.

Please note: There is no babysitting at the Basque Center during the Morzilla dinner.

History Corner: Morzilla Dinner & Bazaar

History Corner is a featured column in the Euzkaldunak newsletter that is written by members of the **Basque Center Renovation Committee**. Our seven-decade old building is aging and needs our enthusiasm and support to carry our traditions forward for the next seven decades and beyond. The goals of the History Corner are: 1) highlight the many beloved traditions we can carry out thanks to having access to a Basque Center, and 2) educate members about our rich Boise Basque history.

Even before the newly formed Euzkaldunak had its own building, the members held events in the Fall that were the beginnings of the annual Bazaar and Morzilla Dinner. A "Box Social" took place November 12, 1949; it was put on by the Basque Girls' Club (aka the Knitting Club). We would love to know how this worked and what happened. There was music! A record of the expenses indicates that \$10 each was paid to musicians Domingo Ansotegui, Jimmy Jausoro and Joe Anacabe. The net profit was \$372.69 for the event. A "Farmer's Dance" followed on December 10, which earned Euzkaldunak an additional \$495. In 1950 a "Tripe Feed" was suggested by Tom Bicandi and planned for mid-November for members, particularly for sheepherders. Teles Hormaechea pointed out that "members from Marsing and Homedale would be too busy with their crops at that time and would be unable to attend." So the Tripe Feed was moved to December 3 at the Eagles Hall. In addition to the "tripa calos" prepared by Julia Gandiaga, the menu included baked ham, salad, pickles, bread & wine. By the fall of 1951, we had our own building. Other than dances that were held every two weeks as a source of revenue, there was an occasional dinner—such as the "Turkey Dinner" held in November. The "Morzilla Jana" dinners continued for many years until finally paired with the "Carnival/Bazaar." At the annual Euzkaldunak meeting in January 1959, "Mrs. Zenon Isaguire [Hazel Archabal] was announced as chairman of the Bazaar for the coming year." This was the start of the annual Bazaar & Dinner.

The Basque Girls' Club was important to the success of the Bazaar. In addition to doing much of the cooking and kitchen work for the morzilla dinner, their members worked for months preparing homemade items to sell—quilts, toys, socks, baby clothes, aprons, hot pads, Christmas ornaments. Other homemade items, as well as candy and baked goods, were contributed by membership. In the mid-70s, Aiztan Artean (the "new" ladies' club) began supplementing—and later managing—the booth for homemade items. The Aiztan girls also spent months prior to the Bazaar working on various crafts to sell.

At first the carnival aspect involved an actual "Cake Walk." Homemade cakes were donated to this event; tickets were probably 25 cents. The Cake Walk is the favorite memory for members of all ages: participants would walk around the circle with numbered boxes to music, and then stop on a number when the music stopped. Gradually, and mainly to save floor space, the Cake Walk became the "Cake Wheel." The spinning wheel determined the winning number and cake. For a couple of years, there was even a fortune teller—a big hit! Euzkaldunak really got into the carnival scene when they hired a company to operate several games and activities, such as a ring toss, race car track and a duck pond where participants scooped up a numbered duck that corresponded to a prize. For some games, a few of our members remember getting goldfish as a prize; another remembers baby chicks! Members recall the Money Tree, a small tree with 100 one-dollar bills pinned to it. This was won by a raffle, the winning ticket drawn near the end of the evening. In the early years, members bought raffle tickets while attending the Bazaar. Later,

raffle tickets arrived with the newsletter several weeks prior to the Bazaar, and members could fill out and mail them back to the Center with a check or bring payment the night of the event. The Money Tree was a Bazaar tradition that probably lasted for 30 years.

Our unique Morzilla Dinner which is paired with the Bazaar has evolved from a family-style sit-down affair, which at one time was available only to members and a limited number of guests. As was outlined in last month's newsletter, the preparation of the morzillak is a major project. A week's work of making the sausages culminates on Friday with the packaging—but saving plenty of them for Saturday's dinner. The Morzilla Dinner is an event that is now open to the public and offers a buffet dinner with two serving times—always a packed house in the basement. The fact that the freshly made morzillak (blood sausages) are being served does not keep away guests. In addition to morzillak, there are other meats and fish options and a variety of chef-prepared dishes. For many years, the dinner has been hosted by Boiseko Gazteak. Thus, parents and families of children in the four dance groups are volunteers for this event. For many of them, this is a totally new (and fragrant!) experience.

Meanwhile, in the Main Hall, we now hold a food booth for chorizos, hot dogs and soft drinks, a Cake Wheel operated by the Oinkari Basque Dancers with cakes donated by Oinkari parents and families, and a member favorite, BINGO! Prizes are donated by various local businesses, clubs and members. BINGO, like so many other games, has evolved, with electronics now part of the system. It's a fun game that everyone can play, but still you need to pay attention and use the current card color.

The Bazaar booths that offered homemade crafts, specialty items and prepared foods and baked goods have come down to one booth. But where else can you buy fresh porruak (leeks) and morzillak that were packaged just a day ago? In addition, members donate foods and baked goods prepared in their own homes. There are always surprises: soup & garbanzos, membrillo (quince "jam") with walnuts, bags of home-grown peppers or other garden items, jars of homemade jellies or pickles or pears and anything baked or fried.

Let's rejuvenate Food Booth 2022! Prepare whatever is your specialty—or find a recipe for something your amuma made. It does not have to be Basque or extraordinary. Cookies are always favorite items. (Bring your items in containers that you do not expect to be returned.) If it doesn't work out for you to donate an item that will be sold at the Food Booth, please be a customer.

Visit the Food Booth after the morzilla dinner on November 5 and take home something special!

IRA QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

If you are age 70 ½ or older, you may be interested in using your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to support The Basque Foundation and its mission. By using the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) rules, a gift of up to \$100,000 can be given directly to a qualified charity from an IRA account without being taxable to the IRA owner. As opposed to a normal charitable gift, a QCD may have the following benefits:

- The QCD can count towards satisfying an individual's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the tax year
- The distribution is excluded from the taxpayer's income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability, even if the taxpayer does not itemize deductions
- The QCD is a gift that is not subject to the deduction limits like other charitable donations

As we progress towards year end, please consider contacting your IRA custodian and your tax advisor to see if this approach may fit within your financial plan.
