We hope everyone stays after dinner to enjoy the Sheepherders Ball festivities! At 8 PM the Oinkari Basque Dancers will perform and debut their new dancers. After the performance the traditional lamb auction will commence which will raise funds for the charities account. The dance, featuring hori bai! (formerly Triki Taka Stomp) and Amuma Says No, will kick off after the auction. The cost of admission to the dance is \$5. Children 12 and younger are admitted for free. Chorizos and drinks will be sold during the dance.

SHEEPHERDERS BALL PRIMARY RECIPIENT



Each year the Euzkaldunak board considers candidates to be the primary recipient of funds raised during our annual charity fundraiser, the Sheepherders Ball. For 2025 the board has chosen Jamie VanOverbeke. Jamie is the son of Alyssa and

Matt and brother of Brooks, a local Idaho family, who joyfully welcomed their newest addition to their family in July. Jamie was born at only 5 lbs and 11 oz, but Alyssa and Matt were quickly able to bring Jamie home to soak in all the newborn snuggles and embrace life as a family of four. Amid the joy and love surrounding Jamie, Alyssa and Matt received unexpected news; one of Jamie's newborn screenings flagged a rare set of genetic conditions. This marked the beginning of a month filled with tests and more tests, each one leading to more questions. Many of the doctors they encountered had never treated these conditions and were unsure of the next steps. After weeks of uncertainty, the diagnosis came. Jamie has a condition called Zellweger Spectrum Disorder. This is an incredibly rare genetic condition, with only 1000 diagnosed cases worldwide. It's caused by mutations in the genes that form peroxisomes, tiny structures in our cells that help break down toxins and fats. Zellweger impacts multiple organs, including the brain, liver, kidneys, and nervous system. Jamie is currently the only known child in Idaho with this diagnosis. In fact, Alyssa and Matt have spent much of their early medical appointments simply educating their care team, many of whom had never encountered Zellweger before. Understanding what the condition is and what it could mean for Jamie's future is something that remains uncertain. With this diagnosis comes not just heartbreak, but even more tests, surgeries to help Jamie feel

comfortable, hearing aids so he can hear his mom, dad, and brother's voices (which, considering he is growing, need replaced every month), and ongoing doctor's appointments to monitor his progression. Every step taken is to bring Jamie as much comfort as possible. As if having a medically complex child isn't challenging enough, navigating the healthcare system and daily life with a child who has extra needs brings its own set of burdens: copays, surgeries, missed work, full-time caregiving, specialized equipment, specialized formula, gas, babysitters, in-home nursing, the list goes on. No matter how well you prepare for life's rainy days, nothing prepares you for something so earth-shattering. Donations made during the Sheepherders Ball will help them cover medical costs and allow Alyssa to be able to care for Jamie without having to worry about returning to work so they can make memories and give Matt, Alyssa, and Brooks the chance to fill Jamie's days with as much life and love as possible without the added burden of financial worry.

BASQUE FOUNDATION - BASQUE CHARITIES

The first Sheepherders Ball was held in 1929 after John Archabal convinced two Basque men's organizations to combine their annual Christmas dances into one unified event. There is no definitive information as to when the name "Sheepherders Ball" was adopted, but the idea has always been the same: an annual dance for Basques. In 1974 the Sheepherders Ball was the first one open to the public and had close to 1000 participants. Basil and Dorothy Bicandi Aldecoa donated a lamb for the annual lamb auction for charity, which earned \$2,205 from 16 different bidders. The Basque Foundation Charities has benefitted ever since from the Sheepherders Ball and Lamb Auction. Donations to deserving people are made throughout the year, but as December approaches, the Basque Foundation (formerly known as Basque Charities) selects a person or family to receive a sizable contribution from the charities account. Typically, the recipient is someone (Basque or non-Basque) who has fallen ill and needs help financially.

MANUEL LEKUONA AWARD

Congratulations to Gloria Totoricagüena Egurrola who has won the 2025 Manuel Lekuona Award from the Society of Basque Studies, Eusko Ikaskuntza, in Euskal Herria. This prize rewards lifetime distinguished contributions to Basque identity and culture and Gloria is the first person not living in the Basque Country ever selected. The international jury highlighted her "pioneering" role with four decades of global fieldwork and research regarding cultural, historical, political and diplomatic aspects of the Basque diasporas in Argentina, Uruguay, Chile, Paraguay, Brazil, Peru, Venezuela, Australia, Philippines, Belgium, United Kingdom and the United States as well as her contribution to the international knowledge of the Basques when collaborating with other ethnic diaspora communities. Gloria has earned degrees in Political Science and a Master's in Education from Boise State. She earned another graduate degree in Latin American Political Economy from the University of Montevideo, Uruguay. Her PhD is from the London School of Economics and Political Science, and she has authored an extensive list of publications, including Boise Basques: Dreamers and Doers. She was the Director of the Center for Basque Studies at UNR and taught Basque Studies at Stanford University before accepting a position with the Basque Presidency of Ibarretxe as a consultant for Basque Global Initiatives think tank. The award (a bronze sculpture by Remigio Mendiburu) will be presented at a public event scheduled for spring 2026 in Gernika.


